



# TA-DAAN DIY GRANNY-SQUARE POCKET

# GRANNY-SQUARE POCKET

## What you need:

- Yarn of your choice (leftovers and scraps would work perfectly!);
- crochet hook depending on your yarn thickness;
- Measuring tape;
- Scissors;
- Darning Needle;

## Final Measurements:

10x10cm (the granny-square could be bigger/smaller depending on how many round you decide to crochet)

## Stiches and Abbreviations:

Instructions are written using US terminology.

ch = chain;  
st = stich;  
sl st = slip stitch  
dc = double crochet

## Beginning and 1st round

Ch 4 and create a loop by sl st in the first ch; ch 3, dc 2 in the center of the loop; \*ch 2 (these 2 chain will create a corner) and work 3 dc in the center\* repeat from \* to \* 2 more times. To complete the first round ch 1 and sl st in the last st of the 1st ch, this will create the last corner (see *image 1*).

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# INSTRUCTIONS

## Following rounds

Turn your work at the beginning of a new round. You can keep crocheting with the same yarn or you can change color (see *image 2*).

Either way start each new round with ch 3, work 1 dc in the corner of the previous round, \*dc 1 in each dc of the previous round. Once you've reach the next corner dc 2 in the corner, ch 2 and work 2 more dc to complete the corner\*. repeat from \* to \* 2 more times. To complete the round: dc 1 in each dc of the previous round, dc 2 in the corner, ch 1 and sl st in the last st of the 1st ch.

## Close the granny-square

To close the last round of your granny square: ch 2, loose the loop on the hook and cut it so that you have a 10cm tail. Thread the yarn into the needle and insert it into the 1st dc of the corner (see *image 3*), then insert the needle back into the last chain you did with the hook (see *image 4*). In this way you create a final stitch and the joining it's invisible (see *image 5*). Weave in the ends on the back of your work.

### Tips for the perfect granny-square:

- Turn the work at each round to prevent your square from twisting;
- Do 1 ch (instead of 2 ch) when finishing a round so that the last corner (with the sl st as joining) is as big as the others. The only exception is the last round!;

### Additional (If you make the t-shirt pocket):

- sew the corners of the granny square first, to secure it in place and prevent it from moving while stitching the sides.
